World's Largest Volunteer Beach Cleanup Comes to the Great Salt Lake

Loveland Living Planet Aquarium joins hundreds of thousands of people around world for the 29th annual International Coastal Cleanup.

Salt Lake City, UT – Saturday, Loveland Living Planet Aquarium volunteers are participating in the 29th annual International Coastal Cleanup, the world's largest single day volunteer effort to clean up our beaches, lakes and rivers. Volunteers will help clean up debris along the shore of the Great Salt Lake. Friends of the Great Salt Lake and Nature Conservancy volunteers will also be there to help with the cleanup.

Ocean trash compromises the health of humans, wildlife, and the economies that depend on a healthy ocean. Every piece of trash volunteers find will be tracked and included in an annual index of global marine debris to be released in 2015.

Last year, nearly 650,000 people picked up more than 12 million pounds of trash along 13,000 miles of coastline.

Keeping our ocean free from trash is one of the easiest ways to make the ocean more resilient. From creating less trash to using proper trash disposal, everyone can help keep our ocean clean and free of debris.
