ANIMAL VISION: Through Nature's Eyes Opens This Week

Draper, UT (June 24, 2019) - See the world from a new, eye-opening perspective at Loveland Living Planet Aquarium's new exhibition, ANIMAL VISION: Through Nature's Eyes, opens Wednesday, June 26. Guests will explore how animals view their environment and learn how humans see in comparison.

Did you know Giant clams have several hundred eyes? Or that pigeons have a nearly 360° field of vision? Guests will learn amazing facts like this and so much more about how insects, reptiles, fish, mammals, and birds see. Interactive displays showing what infrared vision looks like and how compound eyes work, along with two unique photo ops, are featured as part of the new exhibition. ANIMAL VISION also includes a scavenger hunt.

"We wanted to give our guests a new way of seeing the animals, and take time to really understand their diverse adaptations for vision because sight is so different for each species," said Ari Robinson, Director of Creative Design and Exhibits.
