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Explore From Home with All New Virtual Adventures for Kids by Loveland Living Planet Aquarium

Draper, UT (June 18, 2020) – For the first time, Loveland Living Planet Aquarium is offering virtual programs for kids. These programs, called Virtual Aquarium Adventures, are designed for grades K-5 (ages 5-11).

Each camp includes three days of live, 2-hour online sessions full of guided, story-based activities, as well as an Explorer Kit with all the materials needed to complete fun art, science, and engineering projects. Participants can choose from five STEM-based (science, technology, engineering, and math) adventures, each featuring unique themes and challenges ranging from an undersea race for an ancient shipwreck to deserted island survival.

“We wanted to create a really unique experience for children, to get them excited about learning and exploring,” said Bryan Benham, Director of Education for the Aquarium. “In these Virtual Adventures, kids aren’t passive participants. Instead, they get to play a role in a story and work together to overcome challenges and discover new things.”

The Aquarium canceled in-person Summer Camps this year due to COVID-19. Virtual Adventures will run weekly from June 23 to August 13.
